CODE OF ETHICS FOR FINANCIAL PROFESSIONALS

Introduction

This Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals applies to each of the principal executive officer, the principal financial officer and the principal accounting officer or controller of FXCM Inc. (the “Company”), and to other professionals of the Company serving in a finance, accounting, corporate treasury or tax role (collectively, “Financial Professionals”). The purpose of this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals is to promote honest and ethical conduct and compliance with the law, particularly as related to the maintenance of the Company’s financial books and records and the preparation of its financial statements. The obligations of this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals supplement, but do not replace, the Company’s Code of Business Ethics and Director, Officer & Employee Conduct and applicable compliance manuals.

Pursuant to this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals, you are expected to:

1. Engage in and promote ethical conduct, including the ethical handling of actual or apparent conflicts of interest between personal and professional relationships, and to disclose to the Company’s General Counsel any material transaction or relationship that reasonably could be expected to give rise to such a conflict.
2. Carry out your responsibilities honestly, in good faith and with integrity, due care and diligence, exercising at all times the best independent judgment.
3. Assist in the production of full, fair, accurate, timely and understandable disclosure in reports and documents that the Company files with, or submits to, the Securities and Exchange Commission and other regulators and in other public communications made by the Company.
4. Comply with applicable government laws, rules and regulations of federal, state and local governments and other appropriate regulatory agencies.
5. Promptly report, openly, confidentially or anonymously, to the Audit Committee of the Company’s Board of Directors, the General Counsel or to the Company’s Ethics and Compliance Hotline (i) any questionable accounting, internal accounting controls or auditing matters; (ii) non-compliance with applicable legal and regulatory requirements or this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals; or (iii) retaliation against employees and other persons who make, in good faith, allegations of questionable accounting, internal accounting controls or auditing matters, in each case through any avenue available, including:
 - (a) in writing to FXCM Inc., Attn: Audit Committee or General Counsel, 55 Water Street, 50th Floor, New York, NY 10041;
 - (b) by calling (877) 882-3925 at any time; or
 - (c) by accessing <http://reportlineweb.com/fxcm> and submitting a message.

6. Never take, directly or indirectly, any action to coerce, manipulate, mislead or fraudulently influence the Company's independent auditors in the performance of their audit or review of the Company's financial statements.
7. Be accountable for adherence to this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals, both by yourself and by other Financial Professionals.

The Company will take all necessary actions to enforce this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals, up to and including immediate dismissal. Violations of this Code of Ethics for Financial Professionals may also constitute violations of law which may expose both you and the Company to criminal and civil penalties.
