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PENNSYLVANIA AMERICAN WATER ANNOUNCES \$470,000 WATER LINE PROJECT IN NEW CUMBERLAND

HERSHEY, Pa. (September 5, 2017) – Pennsylvania American Water today announced new construction to replace aging water main in New Cumberland Borough to improve service reliability and enhance water flows for fire protection. The project, with an estimated cost of nearly \$470,000, will replace outdated and undersized pipe dating as far back as the 1940s.

Crews recently started installing almost 2,200 feet of new eight-inch ductile iron pipe along Haldeman Avenue between Brandt Avenue and Anna Street. Construction will take place weekdays between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. The company expects to complete the new main installation, testing and disinfection, and connecting customers' service lines to the new main by the end of October, with final paving restoration scheduled for completion during spring 2018, weather permitting.

Traffic restrictions will be in place during construction hours. Motorists are urged to give themselves additional time when traveling through the area during construction.

This project follows Pennsylvania American Water's pipeline upgrades earlier this summer in June in New Cumberland along Market Street, 12th Street and 7th Street.
