



CACI Awarded \$24 Million Prime Contract to Support U.S. Central Command Communications Initiatives

New Work Will Enhance Capability to Disseminate Information in Multiple Languages and Communicate with Diverse International Audience

ARLINGTON, Va.--(BUSINESS WIRE)-- CACI International Inc ([NYSE: CACI](#)) announced today that it has been awarded a \$24 million prime contract to support the United States Central Command (USCENTCOM) with its communications initiatives. This five-year award (one base period with four option periods) is new work for CACI and will enable the command to more effectively engage with its geographically and culturally diverse audience in multiple languages.

With national and international partners, USCENTCOM promotes cooperation among nations, responds to crises, and deters or defeats state and non-state aggression. The command supports development and, when necessary, reconstruction in order to establish the conditions for regional security, stability, and prosperity.
