



CACI Awarded Prime Position on \$985 Million Multiple-Award Contract to Support Air Force Medical Service

Consultant, Advisory, and Technical Services to Sustain Worldwide Medical Service Missions

ARLINGTON, Va.--(BUSINESS WIRE)-- CACI International Inc (NYSE:CACI) announced today that it has been selected as one of 13 prime contractors to support the Air Force Medical Service (AFMS) on the Consultant, Advisory, and Technical Services (CATS) contract vehicle. With a ceiling value of \$985 million, this five-year (one base plus four option years) indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity contract represents new work for CACI and expands its healthcare IT core capability.

The Air Force Medical Service is comprised of nearly 60,000 active duty, Reserve, civilian, and contract medical and support professionals who are responsible for the care of more than 2.6 million patients. The AFMS and its related entities throughout the continental United States and territories, including the Air Force Surgeon General's Office, will use the CATS contract vehicle to acquire management and professional support services that are essential to running an enterprise healthcare system.

Under the CATS contract, the company will compete for Advisory & Assistance (A&AS) task orders related to policy services, engineering and technical services, and studies and analysis.
