The Clorox Company is a multinational manufacturer and marketer of consumer products, with fiscal year 2008 revenues of \$5.3 billion. Clorox is headquartered in Oakland, Calif., and employs about 8,300 people worldwide.

Founded in 1913 as The Electro-Alkaline Company, the company originally produced industrial-strength liquid bleach at its first plant in Oakland, Calif., and sold it to industrial customers in the San Francisco Bay area. For its first 56 years, Clorox remained a one-product company.

Today, Clorox manufactures a wide range of consumer products in more than 15 countries and markets them in more than 100 countries. The company also sells products to food service and professional cleaning customers throughout the United States.

The company's products include: its namesake bleach and cleaning products, Green Works™ natural cleaners, Armor All® and STP® auto-care products, Fresh Step® and Scoop Away® cat litter, Kingsford® charcoal briquets, Hidden Valley® and K C Masterpiece® dressings and sauces, Brita® water-filtration systems, Glad® bags, wraps and containers, and Burt's Bees® natural personal care products. In Latin America, some of the products Clorox manufactures and markets are: Ayudín® bleach, laundry additives and spray cleaners; Bon Bril® cleaning utensils and household cleaners; and Poett® laundry additives, cleaners and air fresheners. In Asia-Pacific, some of the products include: Chux® cleaning cloths, sponges, scourers and disposable gloves; Gumption® paste cleaner; and Handy Andy® cleaners.

The Clorox portfolio of products is produced at manufacturing locations in the United States, Puerto Rico, Canada, Latin America, Europe, the Far East, Middle East and Africa. New products are developed at the company's research and development facilities in Pleasanton, Calif.; Willowbrook, Ill.; and Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Clorox is committed to making a positive difference in the communities where its employees work and live. Founded in 1980, The Clorox Company Foundation has awarded cash grants totaling more than \$73.4 million to nonprofit organizations, schools and colleges. In fiscal 2008 alone, the foundation awarded \$3.7 million in cash grants, and Clorox made product donations valued at \$5.3 million.

Clorox is a publicly held company; its shares are listed on the New York Stock Exchange under the trading symbol CLX.
