

Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Digirad is committed to maintaining the highest standards of ethical and social responsibility and to providing our customers with ethically sourced products.

The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) adopted final rules for reporting and disclosure requirements related to “conflict minerals,” as directed by the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010. The rules require manufacturers who file certain reports with the SEC to disclose whether the products they manufacture or contract to manufacture contain “conflict minerals” that are “necessary to the functionality or production” of those products. The specified minerals, which are referred to as “conflict minerals”, are Tin, Tungsten, Tantalum and Gold.

Digirad supports the actions of the SEC and has either obtained, or is in the process of obtaining, information from our current suppliers concerning the origins of the metals that are used in the manufacture of Digirad products. Based upon information provided by our suppliers, Digirad does not knowingly use metals that are not certified as “conflict free” in our products.

As part of Digirad’s due diligence process, we require all our suppliers to provide documentation of the source of all conflict minerals in raw materials used to produce or used in the materials to manufacture components and products supplied to Digirad.
