Montréal, Québec, September 6, 2002 – The Montréal Exchange will unveil a commemorative plaque in honour of industry colleagues and the other victims of the tragic events of September 11th 2001.

The ceremony, which will take place at the Montréal Exchange on September 11th, will begin at 8:40 a.m. with a brief speech by the President and Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Luc Bertrand, followed by the unveiling of the commemorative plaque and a minute of silence.
