



Yahoos, Glide Kids Explore The Internet With Yahoooligans!

SAN FRANCISCO, CA -- April 25, 1996 -- At an after- school party for low-income kids from the Tenderloin today, members of Glide Memorial Church's "Computers and You" program, Yahoo! co-founders David Filo and Jerry Yang, and Yahoo! "surfers" representing Yahoooligans!, a kid-appropriate online navigational guide to the World Wide Web, will teach the kids how to explore the educational and cultural advantages of the Internet.

"I am thrilled that these kids, some of whom live in temporary housing, can learn to use the Internet to do their homework," notes the Rev. Cecil Williams of Glide Church. "It's a step towards breaking the cycle of poverty."

In addition to teaching the kids how to use Yahoooligans!, Yahoo! co-founders David Filo and Jerry Yang will present a check for \$5,000 to the "Computers and You" program, which offers low- income kids and teens with an opportunity to improve their academic skills and develop self-esteem through computer literacy.

"We are pleased to support Glide in helping children become computer literate and we hope that the kids can take advantage of all that the Internet has to offer to get ahead," says Yang.
